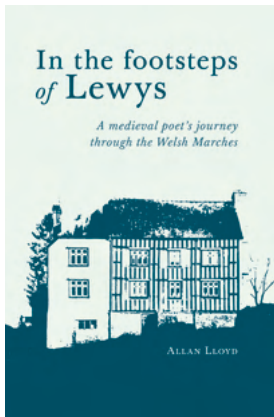


### The Hereford Gospels

Each of the walks in our walk guides passes or visits places and features of interest including churches, chapels, castles, neolithic chambered tombs, standing stones, Iron Age hillforts, Roman camps, forts and roads, medieval houses, inns, mills, canals, old railways, reservoirs and even a nineteenth-century rabbit farming enterprise.
